Resolution No. 141: Korean War Remembrance Certificate

WHEREAS, The American Legion has continuously strived to honor and recognize all Veterans who have so courageously placed their lives in harms' way throughout the world in defense of freedom and democracy for the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, In doing so, has elected to publish and distribute for all American Legion Posts such approved certificates so as to honor those comrades who were assigned to defend against tyranny and oppression in both the European and Pacific Campaigns during World War II, and

WHEREAS, In keeping with that spirit of honored recognition for its comrades who have so bravely fought and paid the supreme sacrifice while in military service for their beloved country; and

WHEREAS, A specially designed certificate specifically for those men and women who unselfishly fought with no less devotion to duty and the American way of life during the all but forgotten Korean War would be of tremendous value and heartfelt gratitude in its presentation to those fellow comrades of The American Legion who served in that conflict; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in Honolulu, Hawaii, August 23, 24, 25, 2005, That The American Legion shall design and publish a Korean War Remembrance Certificate that would be made available either through National Emblem Sales or via the Internet for all American Legion Posts for presentation and dissemination to their qualified members as each Post may warrant.
